Defining Charitable Purpose

Education

Outline process for selecting and appointing board members or directors.

Meeting Procedures

Specify frequency and conduct of general meetings and board meetings.

Decision-Making

Define voting rights, quorum requirements, and decision-making processes.

Admission Criteria

Specify requirements and procedures for becoming a member of the charity.

Member Rights

Outline voting privileges and participation in decision-making processes.

Obligations

Define expected contributions and responsibilities of members to the organization.
