Lady's Bay was closed from June - September 2023, it was one of only 3 bathing waters in Ireland that had POOR water quality in 2022.

"Heavy rainfall and its subsequent impacts/pressures are the main issues associated with this decline in classification. In the event of heavy rainfall Buncrana Wastewater treatment Plant and pumping stations (PS) may result in severe surcharging due to a large volume of surface water being carried by the sewers to the PS causing an inability of the pumps to deal with this. The lack of any storm water storage at the facility is also a contributing factor," a notice placed on the beach by <u>Donegal</u> County Council advised.

Can we improve the water quality in Lady's Bay by redirecting where our water goes in heavy downpours?

A clean home needn't mean a dirty river




Nitrogen, phosphorus and ammonia are three of the most hazardous toxic chemicals that are found in cleaning products.

- spot removers.

Ideas to Create Change



Sustainable Urban Drainage Systems (SUDS)

- reduce pressure on sewerage systems during periods of heavy rainfall.
- reducing the volume of water entering the sewerage system.
- allowing rainwater to infiltrate into the ground or be temporarily stored and gradually released,


